Introduction

The world was stunned by the Facebook and Cambridge Analytica scandal, which exposed Facebook's negligence in safeguarding the personal information of millions of users. The need for action from all organisations is now greater than ever due to the rise in cyber security risks.

GDPR represents the biggest change to Europe's data protection and privacy laws in over a generation. Because of its possible extraterritorial effects, all Middle Eastern and Asian businesses may be required to comply with GDPR even if they are not located in Europe. Worldwide, data protection is only going to get more important, therefore businesses need to take steps to better safeguard, protect, and manage customer information.

Organisations that do not comply with GDPR face never-before-seen regulatory, financial, and reputational risks, including significant fines for serious infractions. Penalties for money are severe: up to EUR20 million, or 4% of total yearly revenue worldwide. Noncompliance not only carries financial penalties but also exposes organisations to regulatory investigations, sanctions, individual and class action claims, and even the potential for criminal charges.
